

<u>Guidelines of Assessment Structure and Examination for Class : XI</u> <u>Academic Session : 2024-2025</u>

The Academic Session will comprise of two terms, i.e. Term-I and Term-II.

- The First Term will be from April- September and the Second Term from October March of the subsequent year.
- <u>Periodic Tests</u> for 30 marks will be conducted for all the subjects in Term-I and Term-II, with the syllabus covered till the announcement of test dates.
- The assessment scheme will have **theory**, **internal assessment or practical components** as per syllabus given for each subject.
- <u>Mid Term Exam (Theory & Practical)</u> will be conducted at the end of **Term-I** according to the subject, with the syllabus covered till the announcement of test dates.
- Annual Exam (Theory & Practical) will be conducted at the end of Term-II according to the subject, with 100% syllabus covered in first term and second term till announcement of the dates of the exam.
- Various Class/Practice Tests will be conducted by the subject teachers during the session.
- <u>Internal Assessments</u> All the academic subjects will have <u>20 or 30 or 70 marks</u> (depending on the nature of subject) earmarked for school based internal assessments which will include ASL (in languages), Practical (in theory-practical subjects), Project Work/Viva Voce (in other subjects), and Mathematical Activities (in Mathematics). Reading activities to be taken up simultaneously.
- Mid Term and Annual examination for theory papers, will be conducted for 30 or 70 or 80 marks, depending upon the nature of the subject.
- Composition of Examination Question Papers (Theory) will be as follows:
 - > Competency Focused Questions in the form of MCQs / Case Based Questions, Source-based Integrated questions or any other type = (50%).
 - \triangleright Select response type questions (MCQ) = (20%).
 - \triangleright Constructed response questions (Short Answer / Long Answer type Questions, as per existing pattern) = 30%.
- The **first five subjects** in the chronological order of filling the subjects in the online registration system are considered as **Main subjects**. For students who take **six subjects** (**five main and one additional subject**), it is **mandatory** for them to **appear** and **qualify** in all the six subjects in Class XI.
- If a student has opted for **six subjects**, and if he/she **fails** in any one of the first five subjects, then that subject will be **replaced** by the **sixth additional subject in Class XII board result**, provided the student satisfies the scheme of studies i.e. after replacement either Hindi or English remains as one of the main five subjects. But **in Class XI**, it is **mandatory** for a child to **clear all the six subjects** (**five main and one additional subject)**.
- The students can take the guidance from subject teachers regarding the pattern of **Internal Assessment** and **bifurcation of marks and their weightage**, subject wise. The detailed curriculum (2024-2025) is also available on CBSE website (https://cbseacademic.nic.in//curriculum 2025.html).

- Grading Scale for Co-Scholastic Areas (Class XI) will be:
 - **>** Grade (A-E) on 9-point scale (A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, C2, D1, D2, E).
- As per the CBSE rules, it is **mandatory** for a child **to appear** in **Periodic Tests I & II**, all the **Internal Assessments**, **Mid Term Exams and Annual Exams**. We request you to kindly ensure that your ward appears for these assessments on the dates given by the school and is fully prepared. **It is mandatory for a child to clear in theory and practical exam/project work, separately in each subject.**
- If a child scores less than the minimum marks required to clear the theory as well as the practical exam in each subject in the Annual Exam, then he/she would have to appear for the Compartment to qualify that subject.
- Minimum **75% attendance** is mandatory for a child in the academic session, to appear in the Board Examination.
