

## <u>Guidelines of Assessment Structure and Examination for Classes : VI-VIII</u> <u>Academic Session : 2024-2025</u>

The Academic Session will comprise of two terms, i.e. Term-I and Term-II.

- The First Term will be from April- September and the Second Term from October March of the subsequent year.
- Academic Session will have assessment as Mid Term Examinations (September / October) & Annual Examinations (February / March).
- As per the circular from **Directorate of Education**, **Exam Branch** Regular Assessment of a student will be done throughout the academic session as per the weightage of the marks given in the following table :

> <u>Portfolio</u> - Total Marks (5) for [Term-I + Term-II]: A portfolio is a purposeful collection of intentionally chosen student's work representing a selection of performances that is assembled over time and describes the learner's efforts, progress, growth and achievement in key areas learning outcomes.

> <u>Multiple Assessment</u> - Total Marks (5) for [Term-I + Term-II]: The subject teachers would determine the type and frequency of these assessments which will include observation, oral tests, individual or group work, class discussion, quizzes, field-work, graphic organizers, visual representation etc.

- Periodic Test Total Marks (5) for [Term-I + Term-II]: This pen paper test of 20 marks will be conducted for (English, Hindi, Sanskrit/French, Maths, Science & Social Science) in each term, with the syllabus covered till announcement of test dates. This test will be taken up in the test notebook, in both the terms.
- Mid Term Examination: This will be a written exam taken at the end of Term-I with the syllabus covered till announcement of the dates of the exam. Mid Term examination will be conducted for 60 marks, 2:30 hours duration. Students will be attempting this exam in the prescribed answer sheets which will be provided by the school.
  - > English, Hindi, Sanskrit/French, Mathematics, Science and Social Science = 60 marks
  - **▶** General Knowledge = 25 marks
  - Computer Education = Internal Assessment (20 marks) + Theory (30 marks) = 50 marks
     \*\*Internal assessment will include: (Practical test, Viva, Quiz, Software presentation, Notebook, Oral tests, Puzzle solving, PPTs, etc.)
- Annual Examination: This will be a written exam taken at the end of Term-II with the 100% syllabus covered in first term and second term till announcement of the dates of the exam. Annual examination will be conducted for 60 marks, 2:30 hours duration. Students will be attempting this exam in the prescribed answer sheets which will be provided by the school.
  - > English, Hindi, Sanskrit/French, Mathematics, Science and Social Science = 60 marks
  - **➢** General Knowledge = 25 marks
  - Computer Education = Internal Assessment (20 marks) + Theory (30 marks) = 50 marks
     \*\*Internal assessment will include: (Practical test, Viva, Quiz, Software presentation, Notebook, Oral tests, Puzzle solving, PPTs, etc.)

- Assessment for various parameters will be indicated as Marks / Grades in the report card.
- As per the examination rules, it is **mandatory** for a child **to appear** in the **Periodic Tests I & II**, **Mid Term Examination & Annual Examination**. We request you to kindly ensure that your ward appears for these assessments on the dates given by the school and is fully prepared.
- Minimum 75% attendance is mandatory for a child in the academic session, to appear in the Annual Exam.
