



Guidelines of Assessment Structure and Examination for Class-III
Academic Session : 2025-2026

The Academic Session will comprise of two terms, i.e. **Term-I and Term-II**.

- The **First Term** will be from **April– September** and the **Second Term** from **October – March** of the subsequent year.
- Academic Session will have assessment as **Mid Term Examinations (September / October) & Annual Examinations (February / March)**.
- As per the circular from **Directorate of Education, Exam Branch** – Regular Assessment of a student will be done throughout the academic session as per the weightage of the marks given in the following table :

- **Subject Enrichment Activities** – Total Marks (5) for [Term-I + Term-II] : These activities are defined as the activities leading to experiential learning integrated with each subject and leading to subject enrichment of the child. These activities will be carried out throughout the term; however, these will be evaluated at the term-end. These activities will be conducted as follows :

- **Project Based Activities** – Total Marks (5) for [Term-I + Term-II] : These activities are instructional approaches designed to give students, the opportunity to develop knowledge and skills through engaging projects set around challenges and problems they may face in the real world.

EVS	Activity File, Project File, Poster Making, etc.

- **Portfolio** - Total Marks (5) for [Term-I + Term-II] : This is aimed at enhancing seriousness of the students towards preparing notes for the topics being taught in the classroom as well as assignments. Notebooks will be evaluated on the basis of regularity, punctuality, neatness and notebook upkeep.

- **Multiple Assessment** - Total Marks (5) for [Term-I + Term-II] : The subject teachers would determine the type and frequency of these assessments which will include observation, oral tests, individual or group work, class discussion, quizzes, field-work, graphic organizers, visual representation etc.

Subject	Activities
English	Conversation, Recitation, Reading, etc.
Hindi	Conversation, Recitation, Reading, etc.
Mathematics	Tables, Quizzes, Puzzle Solving, etc.
EVS	Oral tests, Worksheets, Diagrams, etc.

- **Periodic Test - Total Marks (5) for [Term-I + Term-II]** : This pen paper test of **20 marks** will be conducted for **(English, Hindi, Mathematics & EVS)** in each term, with the syllabus covered till announcement of test dates. This test will be conducted in the **worksheet style in both the terms**.
- **Mid Term Examination** : This will be a written exam taken at the end of Term-I with the syllabus covered till announcement of the dates of the exam. Mid Term examination will be conducted for **50 marks, two hours duration in the worksheet style**.
 - **English, Hindi, Mathematics and EVS = 50 marks**
 - **General Knowledge = 25 marks**
 - **Computer Education = Internal Assessment (20 marks) + Theory (30 marks) = 50 marks**
 **Internal assessment will include: (Practical test, Viva, Quiz, Software presentation, Notebook, Oral tests, Puzzle solving, etc.)
- **Annual Examination** : This will be a written exam taken at the end of Term-II with the syllabus covered till announcement of the dates of the exam. Annual examination will be conducted for **50 marks, two hours duration in the worksheet style**.
 - **English, Hindi, Mathematics and EVS = 50 marks**
 - **General Knowledge = 25 marks**
 - **Computer Education = Internal Assessment (20 marks) + Theory (30 marks) = 50 marks**
 **Internal assessment will include: (Practical test, Viva, Quiz, Software presentation, Notebook, Oral tests, Puzzle solving, etc.)

- **Components of Examination Question Paper will be as follows :**

- Syllabus for Term-I and Term-II will be separate. The question papers for Mid Term examination will be set out of syllabus covered in the first term and Annual examination question papers will be set out of syllabus covered in the second term only.

Music (Instrumental)	Participation, cooperation, patience, melody, dedication, honest effort in the work
Physical Education	Participation, team spirit, enthusiasm, commitment, honest effort in the work
Yoga	Participation, team spirit, enthusiasm, commitment, honest effort in the work
Social and Emotional Skills	This assessment is aimed at evaluating the performance of the student to assess social, emotional and behavioural skills viz. Literacy, Empathy, Self-Awareness, Social Awareness, Global Curiosity, Tolerance, Creativity, Responsibility, Self-Management, Persistence, Trust, Co-operation, Stress Resistance, Optimism, Emotional Control, Critical Thinking, Communication, Collaboration, Mindfulness, Recognizing and Confronting Bias, Overcoming Prejudice, Peace Building, Civic Engagement and Compassion

- Assessment for various parameters will be indicated as **Marks / Grades** in the report card.
- As per the examination rules, it is **mandatory** for a child **to appear** in the **Periodic Tests I & II, Mid Term Examination & Annual Examination**. We request you to kindly ensure that your ward appears for these assessments on the dates given by the school and is fully prepared.
- Minimum **75% attendance** is mandatory for a child in the academic session, to appear in the Annual Exam.
